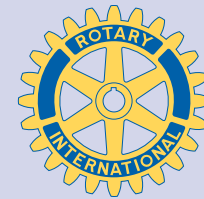

Paul Harris Fellows Recognition

PAUL HARRIS was a founder of Rotary International more than 100 years ago. Rotary clubs around the world honor his name by bestowing a *Paul Harris Fellow* recognition (a \$1,000 donation to *The Rotary Foundation*) on those members of their club or members of the community who best exemplify the Rotary motto “*Service Above Self.*” *The Rotary Foundation* is a not-for-profit corporation that supports the efforts of *Rotary International* to achieve world understanding and peace through international humanitarian, educational, and cultural exchange programs. It is supported solely by voluntary contributions from Rotarians and friends of the Foundation who share its vision of a better world.

Grieving Children and Yarmouth Community for Children/Safe Homes. Additionally, Angie has served as an advisor for the Yarmouth High School Interact Club.
